



- Environmental benefits




## Why are EU funds important for cycling?

Construction of cycle paths in Austria.




The Lifecycle project - a source of practical ideas for cycling campaigns.



Mountain Biking Centres in South Wales.




## How much does the EU spend on cycling currently?



 EU resources for cycling between 2007 – 2013 were 0.6 billion Euro

 Hungary, Poland, Czech Republic and Germany all spent over 100 million Euro

## The ECF is targeting 6 billion Euro for 2014 -2020. What does that get you?




Construction of 50.000 km of new cycle paths OR


Define your objectives / goals for 2020
